MAYORS' MESSAGE

Joint Statement from the Mayor of Cork County and the Lord Mayor of Cork.

In January 2019, legislation was passed which finalised the extension of the Cork City boundary.

This leaflet aims to inform you, as a resident or business within the transfer area, that your local authority will change from Cork County Council to Cork City Council.

Extensive preparatory work has been carried out by the Chief Executives of both Councils and their staff in planning and organising the transition of over 400 services, involving circa 85,000 citizens, from the County administrative area to the City administrative area

As part of this change, 203 staff will transfer from Cork County Council to Cork City Council. Extensive meetings have been held between the two Councils to prepare for a seamless transfer of services.

The changes come into effect on May 31st 2019.

As County Mayor I would like to thank you for working with us and helping us to deliver our high level of service. It has been our pleasure to serve you.

As Lord Mayor, I look forward to welcoming you to Cork City Council and assure you of a continuation of the services you have received to date. We look forward to working with you.

Both Councils have planned for a seamless transfer of business services.

Cork County Council will continue to collect commercial rates to the end of 2019.

Cork City Council becomes responsible for rates in the extended city on January 1, 2020. There will be no change to Community funding.

During 2019 Cork City Council will be engaging with local communities and meeting with community groups.

2019 / TIMELINE

OUR CITIZENS & RESIDENTS

SERVICE TRANSFER

Citizens are to experience no service delivery changes.

For Housing Applicants, Cork City Council will be the housing authority for

the transition area.

Cork City Council will be in contact by letter with local authority, HAP and RAS tenants.

Ballincollig, Glanmire & Blarney libraries will transfer from County to City with no change for Library members.

If you are a local authority/RAS/HAP supported tenant, your differential rent remains the same in 2019 unless you have a change in circumstances.

Approved housing applicants will be provided with registration details to access the City Council's Choice Based Letting system.

All roads, planning, environment and municipal district services currently operated by Cork County Council will be managed by Cork City Council.

Motor tax arrangements remain unchanged.

Contact numbers for fire and emergency services remain unchanged. Contact 999 or 112 in the event of emergency.

YOUR VOTE

If you live in the transition area, your vote should have transferred automatically to Cork City Council but look at www.checktheregister.ie to confirm.

Polling cards will issue as normal to advise you of your polling station.

THE TRANSFER AREA IN NUMBERS



Every customer and business that has a direct relationship with Cork County Council will be contacted individually over the coming months and advised of the business transfer arrangements.
