CHAPTER 1:

Introduction





1.1 The Heritage of Cork City

Definition of Heritage

Cork City's Heritage is diverse, vibrant and can be seen all around us. It includes Archaeology, Built Heritage, Natural Heritage and Cultural Heritage together with our archives, museum, libraries and other collections. Other important elements of our Heritage include landscapes, geology, and parks. It also includes local history and folklore, maritime Heritage, turns of phrase and accents, local customs and traditional food.

However Heritage is more than just the individual material assets and environment of a place. It is also about the relationship between all these elements and the people of Cork City. In truth Heritage is all of these things. It is what we as a community have inherited from the past and it is what defines our city, making it unique and distinct from any other place.

Heritage in the City

Cork is a city of contrasts and is a mixture of many varied cultural traditions. Its history spans from being a centre of learning and piety in the seventh century to being a prosperous port in later years. The Heritage of Cork City maps and mirrors this diverse and continuous change in Cork and its citizens, from the Vikings through to the Victorians and into the modern era. It is this Heritage which helps make Cork City the vibrant and interesting place it is today. All elements of Heritage can be experienced in Cork City.

Archaeology

Cork City is one of the oldest cities in Ireland and has a rich archaeological record. The city's unique character derives from the combination of its topography, built fabric and its location on the River Lee at a point where it forms a number of waterways. Cork was built on estuarine islands in the marshy valley of the River Lee and gradually developed up the steep hills rising to the north and south. Even the name Cork is derived from the word marsh (Corcach) in Irish.

There are few surviving ancient monuments above ground in the city; however the buried Archaeology of Cork embraces every era of Cork's development. Archaeological excavation provides information on the origin, development and growth of the city as well as the daily lives of its past inhabitants.

The earliest recorded settlement in Cork was a monastery founded by Saint Fin Barre in the seventh century. From historic sources it is evident that by the ninth century the



Vikings were raiding Cork. It is possible that the Vikings may have settled in the area but this is not supported by archaeological evidence. However recent archaeological excavations during the Cork Main Drainage Scheme and on the South Main Street have contributed greatly to our knowledge of the late Viking period in Cork, known as the Hiberno-Norse period.

It is understood that the late eleventh and early twelfth century settlements in the city consisted of a series of raised clay platforms, surrounded by wooden fences on which houses were subsequently built. The Hiberno-Norse city was captured by the Anglo Normans in the late twelfth century and the city was subsequently fortified with stone walls.

Above ground there are only a few surviving medieval and early post-medieval structures such as Red Abbey Tower (fourteenth to fifteenth century) and Elizabeth Fort (early seventeenth century). However the survival of the medieval street pattern is evident within the modern streetscape of Cork. The North and South Main Streets together formed the central spine of the medieval city with laneways and plots running off at right angles to the city wall. These medieval laneways e.g. Cockpit Lane and Angel Lane are today indicated by illustrated bronze plaques.

Cork's pre-eminence as a trading centre and maritime merchant port in the eighteenth and nineteenth century created the most tangible industrial Archaeology and historic remains still survive in the contemporary city e.g. Butter Market in Shandon, Blackpool brewing industries and the Bonded Warehouses in the Port of Cork. Many of the buildings that housed the industries and the associated warehouses, grain stores, malt houses etc have been demolished in recent years, some are derelict or ruinous more are converted to new uses and some have been sympathetically converted and refurbished.

The Cork City Development Plan (2015-2021) contains a number of policies for the protection of our archaeological Heritage. These cover areas such as the preservation of archaeological remains in situ, development on burial grounds, industrial Archaeology, and protection of Cork's Historic Street pattern.

Cork City's archaeological Heritage is protected under the National Monuments Acts. The Record of Monuments and Places (RMP) is a list of all known monuments and places of archaeological interest and significance. In Cork

these range from the town defences to Skiddy's Alms House and all the ground beneath the historic core and environs.

Key actions have been identified in the Heritage Plan to add to and build on the body of work already taking place around the city for the protection and enhancement of the Archaeology of Cork.



Architecture and the Built Heritage

The architecture and built environment of Cork City tells the story of its commercial and social development over time, documenting the progress of the city and reflecting the lifestyle of the people of Cork throughout the ages. The Built Heritage of the city also demonstrates the different building techniques and materials employed and the designs and styles of times gone by.

Much of the attraction of the central parts of Cork City lies in its eighteenth to twentieth century buildings. These range from villas and country houses on the hills to the north and south of the city, the blocks of terraced Georgian style houses associated with the military, the churches and the cathedrals as well as the more modest single and two storey homes provided for the industrial workers. The mills, warehouses, distilleries and breweries and other industrial and maritime buildings in the city bear witness to the great economic expansion from this time.

Often dubbed the city of steps and steeples, Cork's Built Heritage owes a lot to its fascinating ecclesiastical buildings which range from the magnificent St Fin Barre's cathedral to the more modest Honan Chapel. Of particular interest are the early eighteenth century



churches e.g. St Paul's and Christchurch which were part of an extensive re-building programme after the Siege of Cork (1690) giving the city a unique legacy from this period. Some fine examples of classical domestic architecture survive from this period too, in the distinctive red-brick Queen Ann style e.g. 50 Pope's Quay or 11 Emmet Place.

The distinctive character of the city owes much to the groups of vernacular buildings of the historic area of the centre, and of the older suburbs such as Shandon Street and Barrack Street. These buildings, sometimes of brick, but more commonly of plastered stone, with great high pitch slates roofs clearly visible from street level, have distinctive yet subtle features e.g. bow fronts, dormer windows, cambered arches over windows, suggesting closer trading and cultural links with the south of England and America than with Dublin.

The nineteenth century has left a wealth of civic and institutional buildings, the two Cathedrals, the Port of Cork building and Bonded Warehouse, the striking Waterworks on the Lee Road, the churches, schools, convents, and monasteries, epitomized perhaps by St Mary's on Pope's Quay or St Vincent's overlooking the river from its precipice in Sunday's Well.

The internationally renowned Christ the King Church in Turner's Cross is a high point of twentieth century architecture in Cork. Following on from this in the mid twentieth century, Roman Catholic churches were designed and located with aim of housing God among the people of the new municipal suburbs. These churches and the associated and well designed schools, convents

and chapels represent a hugely important contribution to the Built Heritage of Cork City.

The historic built environment is a key element in giving each local area a certain character and is a physical representation of our local history. It may not just be the buildings but can include features such as bridges or stepped lanes, windows or doorways, stone walls or railings, an old trough or post box and even a plaque or a nameplate. All of these things can give a place a special character, which sets it apart, and links us to the past and people who shaped our city.

Many groups of buildings in the city may not be of individual importance but collectively they contribute to the distinctive character of an area. Areas such as Wellington Road/ St Luke's Cross, The North Main St and Grattan Hill/ Mahony's Ave are designated Architectural Conservation Areas.

There are over 1100 buildings and structures in Cork City designated as Protected Structures. This is where a Local Authority considers a structure or building to be of special interest from an architectural, historical, archaeological, artistic, cultural, scientific, social, or technical point of view. These buildings are listed on the Record of Protected Structures (RPS). A study undertaken in the city centre by the National Inventory of Architectural Heritage (NIAH) recommended over 1500 further structures to be included in the RPS. The process of listing these buildings is currently being undertaken on a phased basis.

The Development Plan for Cork City contains policies for the protection of Cork's architectural and Built Heritage. These include a policy to encourage the refurbishment of historic built environment and a series of measures to protect and preserve buildings on the Record of Protected Structures (RPS) and Areas of Special Character (ACAs).

A number of schemes are also currently in operation to enhance the Built Heritage of the city. These include conservation grants schemes for ACAs, painting grant schemes and the waiving of development fees for works carried out on Protected Structures which require planning permission.

Key actions have been identified in the Heritage Plan to build on the body of work already taking place around the city in relation to protecting and enhancing the Architecture and Built Heritage of Cork.

Natural Heritage and Biodiversity

Cork City's Natural Heritage includes our geology, landscape, flora and fauna. The variety of life is often referred to as biological diversity or biodiversity. Surprisingly for an urban environment, Natural Heritage has always thrived in Cork, no doubt due to its estuarine and wetland origins.



The city of Cork is built on a geology consisting of red sandstone and white limestone, which is said to influence the traditional Cork colours of red and white. The city has an attractive physical setting formed by the River Lee Valley and Estuary nestled amongst the ridges rising to the north at Shanakiel, Montenotte and Tivoli and to the south at Maryborough and Grange.

The River Lee, which is 65 kilometres long, runs from its source in Gougane Barra, from west to east through the heart of the city, splitting into the North and South Channels, before discharging into the sea at Cork's deep natural harbour. The rivers and waterways play an important role in the layout and structure of the city and are an integral element of the city's landscape character.

Many mammals, birds, invertebrates and wild plants have adapted to life alongside humans in our urban landscape. Areas such as public open spaces and parks, walkways, golf courses, playing pitches, graveyards and the gardens of suburban houses all provide urban habitats and sanctuary for wildlife in the city.

Habitats and wildlife exist in the most unusual of places. The red, pink and white flowered Valerian (*Centranthus ruber*), as well as the purple and white flowers of the Ivy Leaved Toadflax (*Cymbalaria muralis*) occur in various parts of the city, including urban walls, waste ground and bridges.

The elusive Kingfisher (*Alcedo atthis*) can be seen in the shady banks of the River Lee while the vulnerable Black-tailed Godwit (*Limosa limosa*) spend their winters under the protective bastion of Blackrock Castle. It is reported that over 30 types of birds visit typical city centre gardens, whilst the city is over flown by many other types of migratory birds.

Foxes (*Vulpes vulpes*) have been seen slinking furtively in suburban back gardens while a number of species of bat e.g. Pipistrelle (*Pipistrellus pipistrellus*) and Leisler (*Nyctalus leisleri*), hunt for insects around the Lough. The River Lee is home to fish species such as Salmon (*Salmo Salar*) and Grey Mullet (*Crenimugil labrosus*) with the occasional Harbour Seal (*Phoco vitulina*), Common Dolphin (*Delphinus delphis*) and Orca Whale (*Orcinus orca*) making an appearance, much to the amusement and amazement of the human Cork City dwellers.

A range of sites within the Cork City area are protected under National and EU legislation. These include the proposed Natural Heritage Areas (pNHA) at the Lough, the western part of Lough Mahon, Douglas Estuary and Cork Harbour. The Lough also has an existing status under the Wildlife Act as a Wildfowl Sanctuary. The western part of Lough Mahon is also designated as a Special Protection Area (SPA) for wild birds due to the presence of the significant salt marshes and intertidal mudflats. Under the EU Freshwater Fish Directive the River Lee is designated as a Salmonid river from its source to the Cork City Waterworks, near the Lee Fields.

The Development Plan for Cork City contains a number of policies for the protection of our Natural Heritage. These include policies linking Natural Heritage with recreation, producing a local biodiversity plan, protecting amenity views and prospects, landscape protection zones, ridge protection zones, river corridors, nature conservation designations, tree preservation orders and tree planting.

The Heritage Plan identifies key actions that will both add to and build on the body of work already taking place around the city in relation to protecting and enhancing the Natural Heritage of Cork.



Cultural Heritage

Anyone who has ever visited Cork City will know that the people of Cork City maintain a very strong sense of their own cultural identity and that there is a great pride in our Cultural Heritage. Cultural Heritage is difficult to define. The term Cultural Heritage often refers only to museums, archives and libraries. However, it can also include aspects of our Heritage such as language, music, genealogy, oral history and folklore, sport, traditional food and local history. Cultural Heritage can also be found in the subtle, less tangible aspects of our Heritage including accents, turns of phrase, local customs and collective memories.

Put simply, our Cultural Heritage links us to where we come from, gives our everyday lives a clearer focus and shapes an understanding of our city as a unique and special place.

Cork City is fortunate to have a Cultural Heritage that is rich and diverse. It is home to museums, archives, libraries and third level education facilities, which are a repository for fascinating and valuable collections of Heritage items of local, national and international interest.

Cultural Heritage includes our maritime traditions and our links with the river and the sea. The city's relationship with the River is significant in shaping the development of the city through providing a medium for transport, communication, defence, commerce, biodiversity and recreation. Cork's maritime Heritage is also reflected in the city's coat of arms "Statio Bene Fida Carinis" - A safe harbour for ships.

Cork's long military history is reflected in the number of fortifications throughout the city e.g. Elizabeth Fort, Blackrock Castle and Collin's Barracks and in the names of the streets such as Wellington Road, McCurtain Street, Military Hill.

While not a bilingual city, Cork has a strong Irish language Heritage with links to the Gaeltachtaí to the west of the city.

Traditional food such as tripe, drisheen and spice beef is a legacy of Cork's past as a trading port when the provisions industry to the British colonies made Cork rich.

There is a great interest in the city in all aspects of this rich Heritage. It is an integral part of city life. This is reflected in the number of local Historical, Literary and Scientific, Military and Irish language societies, to name a few, in the city.

Cork City Council provides a focal point for Cultural Heritage activities through its Arts, Sports and Irish Officers along with services provided by the Archives, Museums and Libraries.

The Cultural Heritage actions in this plan are designed to help support and contribute to the existing cultural and framework that will enable the citizens of Cork City to relate and enjoy their Cultural Heritage.

1.2 Cork City Council's Heritage Services

Cork City Council provides a wide range of Heritage services on an ongoing basis. These services are delivered by a number of professional staff working in different Directorates across Cork City Council and a summary is set out below. The Cork City Heritage Plan seeks to support the work carried out by those already working and making a positive contribution to the Heritage of the city within Cork City Council.

Heritage Officer

The Heritage Officer is based in the Strategic Planning and Economic Development Directorate and works across the Council providing advice and guidance on Heritage matters. One of the main functions of the Heritage Officer is to lead the formulation and implementation of the Cork City Heritage Plan in partnership with the Cork City Heritage Forum. It also involves co-ordinating and managing the delivery of Heritage Plan Actions on an ongoing basis in association with colleagues across Cork City Council and local Heritage groups and organisations. The Heritage Officer also inputs to the planning process particularly in the area of Natural Heritage, on a regular basis. The Heritage Officer provides advice and support to members to the public, Heritage groups and organisations and organises Heritage events such as Cork Heritage Open Day and coordinates Cork City Heritage Week every year.

City Archaeologist

The City Archaeologist is based in the Strategic Planning and Economic Development Directorate and provides archaeological support and assistance to all Directorates within the City Council. The key role of the City Archaeologist is to ensure the protection and preservation of the archaeological Heritage of the city and this is primarily done through the planning process. The City Archaeologist is a licensed archaeologist and can carry out archaeological monitoring, excavation and testing on behalf of the City Council. The City Archaeologist is actively involved in promoting knowledge and appreciation of the history and Archaeology of the city and for several years, through the City Council's membership of the Irish Walled Towns Network, has organised a Medieval Day Celebration. Awareness raising initiatives such as a strong publication record highlight the continuous commitment of the City Council to promotion of the city's rich archaeological Heritage.

Conservation Officer

The Conservation Office is based in the Strategic Planning and Economic Development Directorate. The



Conservation Office advises Council staff and the general public on the architectural Heritage of the city, including Protected Structures, Architectural Conservation Areas [ACAs] and Cork City's surviving historic and vernacular buildings. The Conservation Officer inputs into the planning process on a regular basis where it impacts on the Built Heritage, ranging from commenting on planning files, infrastructure projects and enforcement cases to producing policies for the City Development Plan. The Conservation Officer also administers and assesses grant schemes, when funds are available for repairs to the historic fabric of Protected Structures.

Cork City Libraries and Local Studies Section

For many years the specialist Local Studies Section Library of Cork City Libraries has been a much-used resource for all those researching the history and culture of Cork City and county. The range of people using the library is very wide, from school children to post-doctoral scholars investigating all aspects of life in the region. The resources of the library include books, maps, journals, photographs, CDs and DVDs. One of the strongest features of the library is an extensive collection of Cork newspapers both in paper copy and microfilm which is very heavily used. An unusual aspect of the library is a large collection of ephemera including theatre and sports programmes, parish magazines and posters and flyers about events in Cork. All queries about Cork City and county are referred to staff in the library which also provides a genealogical advisory service, an area which has become increasingly popular in recent years. Incoming material is indexed comprehensively and the index to both books and newspapers is available online. The Local Studies Section in collaboration with the E-Library section has produced the very popular Cork Past and Present website which provides online access to a wealth of material about Cork.

Cork City Public Museum


Cork Public Museum seeks to preserve, catalogue and display Cork's rich historical and archaeological Heritage for the people of Cork and tourists alike. The Museum acquires its collection predominately through donated material and occasionally by purchasing items deemed important to the city of Cork. Another important function of the Museum is to facilitate research and provide access to material for students, authors and other researchers. A digitisation programme is planned for the future to allow greater access to the public on line. The Museum also offers guided tours to schools and college students who visit the museum for educational purposes. The Cork Public Museum hosts on average four to five exhibitions every year dealing with a wide variety of topics from historical figures like former Lord Mayors Terence MacSwiney and Thomás MacCurtain to art installations from the Cope Foundation. In addition the Museum collaborates on a number of projects with other Heritage institutions in the city including Cork City Libraries, Cork City and County Archives and University College Cork (UCC).

Cork City and County Archives

Cork City and County Archives was established in 1971 to preserve the archives of the Cork area for the benefit of research, Heritage, and public inspection. Archives are composed of the naturally accumulated records of an organisation generated in the course of its activities that have been selected for permanent preservation. Making proper arrangements for the preservation of, and access to, local records and archives is a statutory function of local government since 1994. The Archives now holds one of the largest and most important cultural assets held in Cork, containing unique information relating to innumerable institutions, places, people and events. Most aspects of the social, political, commercial and cultural history of Cork are documented in its holdings. Collections include local authority archives from Cork City Council and Cork County Council, Town Councils, and various defunct local authorities such as the Workhouse Boards of Guardians. Also held are major sets of personal papers, business records, landed estate papers, solicitors' papers, the records of various private organisations, labour unions, charitable bodies and school records. Many of the collections contain genealogical information



that is not readily available elsewhere, for example, deeds and property records, cemetery registers, workhouse registers, and hospital registers. The Archives has an active programme of listing and digitising records, and the research room and web site are widely used by historians, students, the media, social scientists, local community and Heritage groups, local authority staff, and those researching their family history. In 2006, Cork City Council provided a new purpose built centre, the Seamus Murphy Building that offers the most modern facilities for the preservation and use of archives.



Cork City Council Parks Department

The Parks Department is a division within the Environment and Recreation Directorate of Cork City Council. The Parks Department functions are wide ranging and involve the management and maintenance of the City's 1500 acres of public parks & open space areas, including recreational facilities such as playgrounds, sports pitches, walkways, cycleways, multi use games areas (MUGAs) and the municipal golf course at Mahon.

The Parks Department plays a leading role in the planning, design, development and management of new city parks e.g. Marina Park, the design concept of this 35 hectare site includes a sequence of urban water gardens, watercourses and wetland areas. It is intended that the park will also host cultural events and gatherings and will be implemented over a number of years on a phased basis as funding allows.

Another such park is the Tramore Valley Park, the former Cork City Council Landfill Site at Kinsale Road which will be redeveloped to include 24 hectare parkland, 20 hectare wildlife and nature reserve, all weather pitches, a dedicated area for marquee events, children's adventure playground and sports trails.

The Parks Department is committed to encouraging and enhancing the biodiversity and Natural Heritage of the city's green infrastructure and works closely with many local environmental groups and the Cork Environmental Forum to develop Natural Heritage projects. Their responsibilities also include tree planting and maintenance, managing alien invasive species as well as the developing and managing of public allotments.

The Parks Department is also responsible for the upkeep of four cemeteries in the city including the historic graveyards of St Joseph's and St Finbarr's. They also comment on planning files, infrastructure projects and develop landscape and recreational policies for the City Development Plan.



1.3 Value of Heritage

Value to Communities and Quality of Life

Heritage is of great value on a local level to communities within Cork City. Whether in Blackpool or Blackrock, Mayfield or Mahon, Gurranabraher or Glasheen a place's local Heritage helps to tell the story of its past but also gives clues to how it evolved into what it is now. In a rapidly changing world this gives a community a sense of identity, security and greatly improves quality of life.



Value to Local Economy and Tourism

Heritage has an economic value to the city. It has an important role in improving quality of life for its citizens and contributes to making Cork a good place to live, work and study which in turn helps to encourage inward investment as well as maintaining existing industries, entrepreneurs and workforce.

Heritage is also a vital element of the tourism industry. This is reflected in the recently produced Failte Ireland Cork City and Harbour Interpretive Framework. Surveys of tourists repeatedly show that Heritage is one of the key attractions for them in choosing to visit Ireland and two in every three visitors go to a Heritage site or visitor attraction. Heritage and cultural tourism is growing worldwide and Failte Ireland estimate that in 2013, 6.7 million overseas visitors came to Ireland spending an estimated €4.5 billion.

Their surveys show that after Irish people, and scenery, culture and history is the 3rd most important motivator amongst overseas holiday makers in choosing Ireland as a holiday destination. 83% of overseas holidaymakers state that history and culture is very important when choosing Ireland as a holiday destination.



1.4 Role of the Cork City Heritage Plan

Heritage is not solely about the past. In our rapidly changing world Heritage is also continually evolving and being created. We are creating the Heritage of the future while trying to understand and enhance what we have inherited from the past.

It is important to balance the need for change with the desire for protection of our Heritage. Managing our Heritage in a sustainable manner is essential to the challenge of supporting the development of Cork City particularly in relation to its attractiveness and competitiveness while still improving the care of our Heritage.

The development and implementation of a Cork City Heritage Plan is a key part of achieving this balance and assisting in making informed decision on the care and management of Cork City's Heritage.

1.5 Cork City Heritage Plan (2007 - 2012)

Cork City Heritage Plan 2007-2012 was the first plan of its kind in Cork City. The Plan provided a framework to set out Heritage objectives, priorities and actions within the context of a structured programme. The Plan was ambitious in its scope, themes and objectives. The plan had four principal objectives and there were forty seven actions covering all aspects of Heritage protection and focusing on Built Heritage, Archaeology, Cultural Heritage and Natural Heritage. By the end of the current plan 66 % of actions had been progressed.


Cork City Council, The Heritage Council and other Cork City Heritage Forum partners have invested approximately €875,000 in the implementation of the Cork City Heritage Plan actions.

Successful actions included **Publications** e.g. a Guide to the Record of Protected Structures and A Guide to Nature in the City, **Surveys and Studies** e.g. the Bridges of Cork City, Development of Heritage Trails in Cork City **Training** e.g. Seminar on Ironwork in Cork City, Museum Basics, **Events** e.g. Cork Heritage Open Day and Heritage Week and **Annual Projects** such as the Cork City Heritage Grants Scheme and the Discover Cork Schools Heritage Project. A full list is available in Appendix 1.

An external, independent evaluation was carried out to review the effectiveness, efficiency and impact of the Cork City Heritage Plan. This involved consultation with partners and the public, review of the actions carried out, value for money, delivery and dissemination.

Overall the review found that the implementation of the Heritage Plan was well managed by the Heritage Officer and activities were pursued in a systematic and appropriate way. Recommendations for the next Heritage Plan included developing a plan with a stronger strategic focus, increased participation from Heritage groups and organisations, and an improvement in communication of the Heritage message.






CHAPTER 2:

Cork City Heritage Plan 2015-2020





2.1 Preparation of the Heritage Plan

The formulation of the new Heritage Plan for Cork City presents an opportunity to build on the achievements of the 2007-2012 Plan and to re-imagine the approach to protect, manage, and promote Cork City's Heritage.

Work on the second City Heritage Plan began in 2013. The Cork City Heritage Forum met a number of times to contribute to the external review. The recommendations which arose from the evaluation of the previous Heritage Plan with respect to the makeup and roles of the Heritage Forum and Working Groups were taken on board and a revised Cork City Heritage Forum was established. The Heritage Forum consists of representatives from Local Government, Government Departments and agencies, community and voluntary groups, local history groups, local development organisations and the business community (See Appendix 2).

Consideration was also given to the National Heritage Plan, The National Biodiversity Plan, the City Development Plan and other relevant local and national policies and legislation (See Appendix 3)

The Heritage Forum also established six Working Groups to make recommendations on actions for the new Heritage Plan. The Working groups consisted of Forum members and invited relevant experts or those with an active interest in or responsibility for Cork City's Heritage. These Working Groups covered the topics Built Heritage and Archaeology, Natural Heritage and biodiversity, Cultural Heritage, education and research,

communication and PR, local Heritage groups and organisations. (See Appendix 4)

The Working Groups met to formulate actions for the new Heritage Plan. These recommendations were reviewed and shortlisted by the Heritage Forum. In addition the Heritage Forum identified some general principles and themes which cross cut all of the actions. These are summarised into four overarching goals for the Plan. A series of draft objectives and actions were then identified. These draft actions form the core of this Plan and will be implemented over the life of this Heritage Plan (2015 – 2020). A draft Plan was devised and presented to Council for approval to go to public consultation.

Public consultation is a very important part of the process of developing the Cork City Heritage Plan. A public consultation took place in April 2014 and a total of 25 submissions were received. (See Appendix 6) These comments were reviewed and where possible incorporated in the final draft of the Cork City Heritage Plan.

2.2 Policy Background

Heritage is defined under the Heritage Act 1995 as items such as monuments, archaeological objects, Heritage objects, architectural Heritage, flora, fauna, wildlife habitats, landscapes, seascapes, wrecks, geology, Heritage gardens and parks and inland waterways.

The importance of heritage is also recognised in the Cork City Corporate Plan (2015 – 2019) and the Cork City Development Plan (2015 – 2021). The preparation of the new Cork City Heritage Plan (2015-2020) also responds to the requirements of the various national policies and plans including the National Biodiversity Plan (2011 – 2016) and the Heritage Council Strategic Plan (2012-2016).

The Cork City Biodiversity Action Plan was reviewed in 2014. It was found that many of the actions were not completed due to lack of resources both human and financial. Those actions not completed have been incorporated into the Cork City Heritage Plan 2015 - 2020. This is outlined in Appendix 5.



2.3 Content of the Heritage Plan

The Cork City Heritage Plan is an action plan and sets out a series of realistic and practical actions to protect conserve and manage our Heritage over the next five years and a methodology on the implementation of these actions.

The Plan does not contain actions on every aspect of Heritage, as this would be impossible to achieve in five years. A conscious decision was made to keep to a realistic number of actions and in so doing 13 priority objectives were identified.

A number of key challenges emerged from the Heritage Forum and Working Group meetings and the public consultation process. These included a need to work together with fewer resources both human and financial, to achieve the aims of the Heritage Plan. In practical terms this means that the new Plan has fewer actions, which are more strategic and focussed. The Plan also aims to enable the whole community to take part in the work of caring for and managing our local Heritage. It will facilitate relevant stakeholders and others to work together to achieve result in a mutually beneficial way so all parties benefit and their expertise is valued and rewarded. We must also be aware of the interests of building owners and businesses so actions in the Plan have been framed with a view to balancing the interests of all parties and stakeholders within our local communities. The Plan will also contribute to Cork City's economy by supporting the tourism and recreation sectors which are underpinned by our natural, built and Cultural Heritage.

A number of issues were identified such as care and conservation of institutional buildings, dereliction, litter and vandalism which are outside the remit or control of the Heritage Plan. However the Heritage Forum acknowledges that these are valid and important issues to the Heritage of Cork City and will review progress with regard to these issues during this five-year plan.

2.4 Aim, Goals, Objectives and Actions of the Plan

The Heritage Plan sets out four high level goals, under which there are a total of 13 objectives which will be undertaken during the lifetime of the Plan. A number of actions are attached to each objective and outline how the objective is to be met.

Each objective meets the overall aim of the plan and may contribute to more than one goal. Wherever possible, actions are clear with an indication of a timeframe and key performance indicators (KPI) clearly identified. However given the uncertainty in relation to resources, both financial and human at implementation stage, it is important that the Plan retains flexibility to respond to changing circumstances.

The overall aim of the Cork City Heritage Plan is;

“To protect and promote the Heritage of Cork City and to place the care of our Heritage at the heart of the community”



Heritage Plan Goals

1

Promote care and management of our Heritage

Caring and managing our Heritage is at the core of what the Heritage Plan sets out to do. This is achieved through promoting best practice and encouraging the care, conservation and protection of our Heritage.

2

Communicate Heritage message to a wider audience and raise awareness and enjoyment of Heritage.

The need for better communication of the Heritage message was one of the clearest outcomes from the Heritage plan review process. Good communication is required to raise awareness of Heritage issues and garner public support for the protection and care of our Heritage while also facilitating greater enjoyment of Cork City's rich Heritage for everyone. Heritage events will play a key role in attracting more people to explore and enjoy their Heritage.





3

Support education, research and training

Learning more about our Heritage by collaborating with collecting and research institutions and bodies, and commissioning research which adds to our knowledge is important, as is providing training opportunities for those interested in managing their local Heritage.

4

Increase level of community activity for Heritage and forge stronger links with business and tourism interest groups

Heritage groups and organisations, dedicated individuals and local communities play a key role in caring for and raising awareness of our Heritage and in adding to our knowledge of our Heritage. Their work must be supported and we must meet the challenge of engaging more people across the city in this work in a mutually beneficial way. Heritage also underpins the tourism industry and is an important element in outdoor recreational activities.



CHAPTER 4:

Implementation of

Heritage Plan





4.1 Delivery of the Plan

The Cork City Heritage Plan 2015-2020 is a five year action based plan. Each year a detailed work programme will be drawn up setting out proposed actions for the year, identifying a timeframe and partners. In addition each action will include key performance indicators a delivery, implementation, dissemination and review element. This work plan will be agreed by the Heritage Forum. The Heritage Officer will act as coordinator for many of the projects identified in the Heritage Plan. However the Heritage Forum will also seek the participation of key partners and focused working groups in the delivery of the actions identified. It is envisaged that the Cork City Heritage Plan will be a partnership plan with many stakeholders sharing responsibility for its implementation in a mutually beneficial manner. The Heritage Plan is very much for all the people of the city and is underpinned by the principle of shared responsibility for our Heritage.

4.2 Role of the Cork City Council and the Heritage Officer


Cork City Council initiated the Heritage Plan process and facilitated its development through the work of the Heritage Officer. While Cork City Council is a key partner and will in many cases act as coordinator for projects, through the Heritage Officer and other relevant staff, all of the actions cannot be implemented without practical support from others. While Cork City Council will play a strategic role in the implementation of the Heritage Plan it will be vital to secure practical support from all relevant partners and stakeholders for the Plan to succeed.

4.3 Liaison those Involved in Ongoing Work that Benefits Heritage in the City

The Heritage Forum acknowledges the huge amount of ongoing work that is being carried out by Heritage groups and organisations, local communities, individuals, voluntary organisations, the local authority and educational institutions to promote protect and better understand the Heritage of Cork City. It is hoped that the Heritage Plan will add value, support and encourage this valuable work already being carried out through out the city. The Heritage Forum will support, where possible, an interdisciplinary approach to Heritage management and the principle of best practice.

4.4 Liaison with Cork County Council and Other Local Authorities

The Heritage Forum acknowledges the close link between adjacent Local Authorities and in particular Cork County Council. Where appropriate The Cork City Heritage Forum will endeavour to work with Cork County Council and other Local Authorities on relevant projects and adopt a common approach to particular issues.





4.5 Liaison with Heritage Council

The support of the Heritage Council through their funding programme for Local Heritage Plans, and for the Heritage Officer post is vital to the ongoing work of Heritage in Cork City. In particular the advice of its Professional Officers and the ongoing support of the Heritage Officer Training and Development Programme is acknowledged as an important vehicle for training and exchange of expertise and information between Heritage Officers throughout the country.

4.6 Finance

An overall budget of €500,000 is estimated for the delivery of the actions over the lifetime of the Cork City Heritage Plan. This will not include the ancillary costs e.g. administrative and professional, involved in delivering the Heritage Plan.

Cork City Council is committed, in partnership with others, to the delivery of the Heritage Plan over the next five years and as resources permit. In addition to financial support, Cork City Council will also support the delivery of the Plan through the work of the Heritage Officer and other staff.

The ongoing support of the Heritage Council is a key factor in ensuring that the actions in the Heritage Plan are achieved. Cork City Council will work closely with the Heritage Council in the implementation of the Heritage Plan.

Funding for actions from the Heritage Plan will also be sought through the commitment of other key partners identified through the actions of the plan. Corporate sponsorship will also be sought for certain actions where appropriate.

4.7 Monitoring and Evaluation

The Cork City Heritage Forum and the Heritage Officer will monitor the annual work programme and will meet on a regular basis to review and evaluate progress. Each action will have a key performance indicator to evaluation its effectiveness. Minutes of the Heritage Forum meetings will be submitted to the Strategic Planning and Economic Development Functional Committee Meeting of Cork City Council. An annual progress report will be prepared by the Heritage Officer and submitted to the Heritage Forum and the Strategic Planning and Economic Development Strategic Policy Committee (SPC) of Cork City Council. In addition an annual progress report will be submitted to this SPC and the Heritage Council.
