

What area is eligible?

The scheme area covers the city centre island quays as detailed by the red dotted line on the map.

What works are eligible?

The scheme covers painting and minor repair works to the external of buildings. The minor repair works which will be considered shall be repairs to rendering, gutters and downpipes.

How much can I get?

The grant will cover 50% of the cost of works up to €1,500. Amounts granted will vary depending on the number of applications received and the identified need of each. In the case of corner buildings (with two frontages/ facades onto the street), a grant of up to €2,500 may be considered, providing sufficient funds are available following the assessment of all valid applications received.

The City Council reserves the right to offer grants in excess of the stated maximums in exceptional circumstances, where the works to the building are considered to be of significant benefit to the area.



How are grants allocated?

Grant allocations will be made on a competitive basis according to the benefit of the project to the building and the area as a whole, as well as the number of applications received. A scoring system will evaluate applications using criteria such as its condition and visual appearance, its prominence and location, its historical importance or protected status.

How do I apply?

Building owners who wish to apply for the grant are required to email a completed application form with three quotations (itemised) for the required works from tax compliant contractors, to **core@corkcity.ie** by not later than **5pm**, **Friday 28th April 2023**. Alternatively, a completed application form with three quotations as outlined above can be sent to Planning Policy Section, City Hall, Cork City Council, Anglesea Street, by not later than **5pm**, **Friday 28th April 2023**.

Failure to submit three legitimate quotations by 28th April 2023 will invalidate application.

Application buildings will be inspected and shortlisted in accordance with the scoring criteria. Applicants will be notified of decisions by Friday 19th May 2023.

Following selection, successful applicants will be required to complete works and submit payment claims by 29th Sept 2023 in order to secure grant funding. Claims for the cost of materials must include detailed/itemised receipts.

Grant funding which has not been availed of or claimed by 29th Sept 2023 will be re-allocated.
