In this report 'the Act' means the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended) and 'the Regulations' means the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended), unless otherwise indicated.

#### 1. Requirements for a Section 5 Declaration

Section 5(1) of the Planning and Development Act 2000 as amended states,

5.—(1) If any question arises as to what, in any particular case, is or is not development or is or is not exempted development within the meaning of this Act, any person may, on payment of the prescribed fee, request in writing from the relevant planning authority a declaration on that question, and that person shall provide to the planning authority any information necessary to enable the authority to make its decision on the matter.

The requirements for making a section 5 declaration are set out in the Act.

#### 2. The Question before the Planning Authority

In framing the question to the planning authority, the applicant states in Q2 of the application form:

"Is the opening of a drive for two parking spaces to allow for off street parking (including demolition of low blockwork wall) exempted development?"

#### 3. Site Description

The property in question is a two-storey end of terrace (of a row of 4) dwelling with a hard landscaped front garden (paved). The front wall has been entirely removed.

### 4. Planning History

No known applications.



#### 5. Legislative Provisions

#### 5.1 The Act

Section 2(1),

"works" includes any act or operation of construction, excavation, demolition, extension, alteration, repair or renewal and, in relation to a protected structure or proposed protected structure, includes any act or operation involving the application or removal of plaster, paint, wallpaper, tiles or other material to or from the surfaces of the interior or exterior of a structure.

#### Section 3(1),

In this Act, "development" means, except where the context otherwise requires, the carrying out of any works on, in, over or under land or 'the making of any material change in the use of any structures or other land'

#### Section 4(1)(h),

The following shall be exempted developments for the purposes of this Act-development consisting of the carrying out of works for the maintenance, improvement or other alteration of any structure, being works which affect only the interior of the structure or which do not materially affect the external appearance of the structure so as to render the appearance inconsistent with the character of the structure or of neighbouring structures;

#### Section 4(2),

Section 4(2) provides that the Minister may, by regulations, provide for any class of development to be exempted development. The principal regulations made under this provision are the Planning and Development Regulations 2001-2013.

#### Section 5(1),

(See section 1 of this report)

#### Section 177U (9) (screening for appropriate assessment)

In deciding upon a declaration or a referral under section 5 of this Act a planning authority or the Board, as the case may be, shall where appropriate, conduct a screening for appropriate assessment in accordance with the provisions of this section.

#### 5.2 The Regulations

Article 9 (1)

Development to which article 6 relates shall not be exempted development for the purposes of the Act -

- (a) (i) if the carrying out of such development would... contravene a condition attached to a permission under the Act or be inconsistent with any use specified in a permission under the Act.
- (a) (viii) consist of or comprise the extension, alteration, repair or renewal of an unauthorised structure or a structure the use of which is an unauthorised use,

#### Article 10 (1)

Development which consists of a change of use within any one of the classes of use as specified in Part 4 of Schedule 2, shall be exempted development for the purposes of the Act, provided that the development, if carried out would not —

- (c) be inconsistent with any use specified or included in such a permission, or
- (d) be development where the existing use is an unauthorised, save where the change of use consists of resumption of a use which is not unauthorised and which has not been abandoned

#### 6. ASSESSMENT

#### 6.1 Development

The first issue for consideration is whether or not the matter at hand is 'development'.

'Development' as defined in the Act (3)(1) comprises two possible chief components: 'the carrying out of any works on, in, over or under land', or 'the making of any material change in the use of any structures or other land'. In order to ascertain whether or not the subject use is considered to be development as so defined, consideration must first be given to whether any works on, in, over or under land have or will be carried out, and secondly to whether any material change in the use of any structures or other land have or will take place.

'Works' is defined in section 2(1) of the Act as 'the carrying out of any works on, in, over, or under land' including 'any act or operation of construction, excavation, demolition, extension, alteration, repair or renewal, and in relation to a protected structure or proposed protected structure, includes any act or operation involving the application or removal of plaster, paint wallpaper, tiles or other material to or from the surfaces of the interior or exterior of a structure.'

I consider that the proposed element constitutes works as it comprises of both demolition (of the existing 4.7m x 1.1m high boundary wall) and the alteration of the surface of the front garden area from soft landscaping to hard landscaping. As the works have been carried out on land, these works constitute development.

#### 6.2 Exempted development

The next issue for consideration is whether or not the matter at hand is exempted development. The works have occurred on the site boundary and are not internal alterations for the improvement of the structure. There are no listed exemptions in the Planning and Development Regulations Schedule 2, Part 1 (Development within the curtilage of the house) which permites the demolition of the front boundary wall.

Class 6 (b) (ii) of the aforementioned regulation states the following:

"Any works within the curtilage of a house for – the provision of a hard surfaced area of the garden forward of the front building line of the house, or in the area of the garden to the side of the side building line of the house, for purposes incidental to the enjoyment of the house as such.." provided –

"that the area of the hard surface is less than 25sq.m or less than 50% of the area of the front garden froward of the front building line of the house, or 50% of the area of the garden to the side of the side building line of the house, as the case may be, whichever is the smaller" or

"if the area of the garden surface is 25sq.m or greater comprises 50% of the area of the garden forward of the front building line of the house, or 50% of the area of the garden to the side of the side building line of the house, as the case may be, it shall be constructed using permeable materials or otherwise to allow for rainwater to soak into the ground".

The hard surfaced area provided is the entire front garden and is not a permeable surface. Therefore, the exemptions open for the provision for a hard surfaced area to the front do not apply in this instance.

Based on the above, it is considered that the development is not exempted development.

#### 7. ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

#### 7.1 Screening for Environmental Impact Assessment

Having regard to the contents of Article 103 (as amended by Article 14 of the Planning and Development (Amendment) (No 3) Regulations 2011) and Schedule 7 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended) it is considered that the proposed development by reason of its nature, scale and location would not be likely to have significant effects on the

environment. Accordingly, it is considered that an environmental impact statement is not required to be submitted.

#### 7.2 Screening for Appropriate Assessment

Section 177U (9) of the Act requires planning authorities to screen applications for a section 5 declaration for appropriate assessment. The provisions of the *Habitats Directive*, the *Appropriate Assessment Guidelines for Planning Authorities 2009* (revised 2010) and the Act are noted. The relevant European sites are the Cork Harbour SPA (site code 004030) and the Great Island Channel cSAC (site code 001058). Having regard to the location of the proposed development site relative to these European sites and related watercourses and to the nature and scale of the proposed development it is considered that the proposed development would not affect the integrity of the European sites referred to above. Accordingly it is considered that appropriate assessment is not required.

#### 8. Conclusion

The question has been asked

"Is the opening of a drive for two parking spaces to allow for off street parking (including demolition of low blockwork wall) exempted development?"

Having considered the particulars submitted with the application and the relevant legislation as set out above, it is considered that the demolition of the boundary wall and the hard surfacing of the entire area forward of the front building line is development and is not exempted development.

#### 9. RECOMMENDATION

In view of the above and having regard to —

- Sections 2, 3 and 4 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended), and
- Articles 6, and 9 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended),
- Class 6 (b) (ii) of Schedule 2, Part 1 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 as (amended)

It is considered that the demolition of the boundary wall and the hard surfacing of the entire area forward of the front building line is development and is not exempted development.



- The Planning Authority may request other person(s) other than the applicant to submit information on the question which has arisen and on which the declaration is sought.
- Any person issued with a declaration may on payment to An Bord Pleanála refer a declaration for review by the Board within 4 weeks of the date of the issuing of the declaration.
- In the event that no declaration is issued by the Planning Authority, any person who made a request may
  on payment to the Board of such a fee as may be prescribed, refer the question for decision to the Board
  within 4 weeks of the date that a declaration was due to be issued by the Planning Authority.

The application form and advisory notes are non-statutory documents prepared by Cork City Council for the purpose of advising as to the type information is normally required to enable the Planning Authority to issue a declaration under Section 5. This document does not purport to be a legal interpretation of the statutory legislation nor does it state to be a legal requirement under the Planning and Development Act 2000 as amended, or Planning and Development Regulations 2001 as amended.




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# Site Location Map
