Health of the Nation, the official Department of Health podcast, was launched on Saturday 20th June. The series provides a platform where health officials, healthcare workers and experts deliver clear information on current health issues. Mental Health Policy and Support Line

The Department's new mental health policy, "Sharing the Vision: A Mental Health Policy for Everyone" was launched last week. A new Crisis Text line – Text **50808** was also launched. The new text-based mental health service will provide support to anyone struggling with any issue,

big or small for free and at any time of any day. The service is staffed by 300 trained crisis volunteers and people can access support by texting 50808.

Updated Guidance for Cocooners

The Department of Health has issued updated guidance for those cocooned for the past few months (see link below). Guidance has been updated to reflect the fact that restrictions are being lifted and people are able to access a greater range of shops, activities etc. which presents added anxiety for people as they re-emerge from a lengthy period of social isolation. The advice is there to inform people about the safe ways in which to engage with the wider community and the precautions to be adhered to.
