Cork City Local Community Development Committee - Community Enhancement Programme 2020

Cork City Local Community Development Committee (LCDC) wishes to invite applications for the 2020 Community Enhancement Programme. The Community Enhancement Programme (CEP) will provide capital funding to enhance facilities in disadvantaged communities across Cork as identified in the Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP) for Cork City.

The following will be considered eligible for the programme:

- Locally based community and voluntary groups,
- Not-for-profit organisations,
- Government Departments and State Agencies (in cases of leveraging funding),
- Projects with a clearly defined community and social cohesion focus,
- Eligible facilities will include community centres, youth clubs, sports/recreation facilities and other not-for-profit organisations facilities.

The closing date for receipt of applications is Friday, 4th of September, 2020.

Bank Of Ireland's Begin Together Awards 2020

Bank of Ireland's *Begin Together* Awards recognise the spirit of enterprise and resilience in towns and cities across the Island of Ireland. They recognise those businesses and communities who came together to support local recovery and rebuilding in response to Covid-19. There

are over 21 financial recognition awards available from a total prize fund of €210,000 with the overall winning town/city village/urban area awarded €50,000 and the title of Ireland's 'most enterprising town'. There is a 'rising star' category focusing on towns that have overcome major challenges and can demonstrate how they have achieved this. Entries for the awards is open until **24 August** 2020. The awards timeline and judging process has been amended in response to Covid-19 and government guidelines; it is important that any submission reflects the full extent of the work underway in a locality. 
